Where and when will the experience take place?

You will be spending time in the CRHP campus in Jamkhed, India, with other APAMSA and non-APAMSA participants. As long as you have a 3 week period available during the summer, we will work to fit the experience into your schedule.

How much will the trip cost?

The trip will cost \$1,750 plus airfare and visa

Is housing and food provided?

Yes. Housing and food during the 3-week program is provided.

Is there financial assistance available?

Very limited funding from APAMSA will be available to help cover some costs. Please try to seek outside aid and/or expect to be responsible for the expense of this trip.

Here is our first APAMSA Global Health Spotlight. For the month of March, we would like to feature our member, Taman Hoang, and her experiences with global health.

Can you tell us a little about yourself?

My name is Tam An Thi Hoang, although I go by Taman. I was born in Saigon, Vietnam, and immigrated to the United States when I was four years old. I grew up with two distinctively different cultures: Vietnamese and American. Though my mother did incorporate some "American" ideas into my upbringing, she always insisted that I remain true to my roots. It was for that reason that I went back to Vietnam in my teenage years to volunteer and to explore my origins. My travels to Vietnam inspired other trips to different parts of the world, from Panama to Nepal and sparked my interest in global health. After I graduated from UC Berkeley, I then pursued an MS in Global Medicine at USC where I was given the chance to go abroad to Panama and work in acute primary care clinics for the indigenous populations there. Shortly after, I was accepted into UC Davis School of Medicine. Before I began medical school, I had the honor of being accepted into the 2015 Good Samaritan Medical and Dental Ministry (GSMDM) cohort and was able to revisit my homeland. I felt I had come full circle, because it was one of my initial trips to Vietnam that drove my desire to go into medicine. I am currently a second year medical student at UCDSOM and have continued my love for global medicine by being on the Nepal 2016 team that journeyed to Kathmandu and some of the remote mountainous villages of Nepal last June.
